
#### INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP SERVICE

**M:** Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

**M:** God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

# FIRST READING - Deuteronomy 5:12-15 (EHV)

<sup>12</sup>Observe the Sabbath day by setting it apart as holy, just as the LORD your God commanded you. <sup>13</sup>Six days you are to serve and perform all of your regular work, <sup>14</sup>but the seventh day is a sabbath rest to the LORD your God. You are not to do any regular work, you or your son or your daughter or your male servant or your female servant or your ox or your donkey or any of your livestock or the alien who resides inside your gates, in order that your male servant and your female servant may rest like you. <sup>15</sup>Remember that you were slaves in the land of Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out from there with a strong hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the day of rest.

## SECOND READING – 2 Corinthians 4:5-12 (EHV)

<sup>5</sup>Indeed, we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup>For the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," <sup>a</sup> is the same one who made light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the person <sup>b</sup> of Jesus Christ.

<sup>7</sup>We hold this treasure in clay jars to show that its extraordinary power is from God and not from us. <sup>8</sup>We are hard pressed on every side, yet not crushed; perplexed, yet not despairing; <sup>9</sup>persecuted, yet not forsaken; struck down, yet not destroyed. <sup>10</sup>We always carry around in our body the death of the Lord Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. <sup>11</sup>To be sure, while we are living we are continually being handed over to death because of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our mortal flesh. <sup>12</sup>So then, death is working in us, but life is working in you.

<sup>23</sup>Once on a Sabbath day, Jesus was passing through the grain fields, and his disciples began to pick heads of grain as they walked along. <sup>24</sup>The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath day?"

<sup>25</sup>He replied to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and hungry (he and his companions)? <sup>26</sup>He entered the

house of God in the time of Abiathar the high priest and ate the Bread of the Presence, which is not lawful for anyone to eat, except for the priests. He also gave some to his companions."

<sup>27</sup>Then Jesus said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. <sup>28</sup>So the Son of Man is the Lord even of the Sabbath."

**3** Jesus entered the synagogue again, and a man was there with a withered<sup>b</sup> hand. <sup>2</sup>They were watching Jesus closely to see if he would heal the man on the Sabbath day, so that they could accuse him. <sup>3</sup>He said to the man with the withered hand, "Step forward!"<sup>c</sup> <sup>4</sup>Then he said to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbath day to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. <sup>5</sup>Then he looked around at them with anger, deeply grieved at the hardness of their hearts. He said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." The man stretched it out, and his hand was restored. <sup>6</sup>The Pharisees left and immediately began to conspire against Jesus with the Herodians, plotting how they might kill him.





Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

#### THE SACRAMENT

Our Lord Jesus has given us a holy Supper in which we receive his true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. In this Supper, we celebrate the gift of his redemption, we bear witness to the fellowship we share as confessors of the truth, and we proclaim his death until he returns.

Following the teaching of the Bible (1 Corinthians 10:17; 11:27-29; etc.), our church practices "close communion." We ask that only those who are current communicant members of this church or another congregation of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS) partake of the sacrament today. If you are a visitor who is not a member of one of our sister churches, our pastor would be happy to speak with you about receiving the Lord's Supper with us in the future. Please mention it to him after the service.

**M:** The Lord be with you.

**M:** Lift up your hearts.


C: We lift them up to the Lord.


#### WORDS OF INSTITUTION


**M:** The peace of the Lord be with you always.

#### **DISTRIBUTION**

At the direction of the usher, communicant members of St. Andrew and our sister churches in the WELS and ELS may come forward down the center aisle, then wait until directed by an usher to go to the communion rail. Communicants may kneel or stay standing. Please hold out your hand to receive the bread. If you wish to partake of the common cup, do not take an individual cup when the assistant comes by with the tray. Those who need to receive grape juice instead of wine may take the purple individual cups in the center of the tray. The minister and assistant will use hand sanitizer before and/or wear sterile gloves during communion setup and distribution. Gluten-free wafers are available; please speak with the pastor or an usher to receive one.

# FREE APOLOGETICS & WORLDVIEW CONFERENCE ONLINE – 6/20 (Thur.)

On June 20 (Thur.), the Center for Apologetics and Worldviews at Bethany Lutheran College (Mankato, MN), is presenting a conference that will be livestreamed for free, entitled "Defending the Gospel of God: The Apologetics of Jesus, Paul, and the Historical Reliability of the New Testament Records." Here is a summary of the conference topics: "When bringing Christ to others, we rightly assume the historical reliability of the gospel records. But our neighbor may not. We may also think that the saving gospel cannot or does not need to be defended – thus, evidence for its truthfulness becomes unnecessary, at best. And so, our unbelieving neighbor views Christian faith as nothing more than

a blind leap. ... Three questions will be discussed and answered at this conference:

- 1. Can the gospel records of Jesus of Nazareth be shown to be reliable? Something much more than exaggerations, myths, legends, or worse?
- 2. If they are reliable, is the gospel that saves defended by Jesus and the apostles? Is evidence given that it is true?
- 3. And if the records are reliable and the gospel is defended by Jesus, Paul, and others, how can the Christian make use of these for the sake of his neighbor both non-Christian and Christian?
