

INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP SERVICE

Jesus preserves our faith even in the face of persecution. In the Bible readings today, we see that suffering often comes as the result of our faithfulness to God's Word, of translating faith into faithfulness. It is a suffering that is promised and that is most painful when it comes from those who have heard that Word with us. Even in the face of such offense, God preserves faith in us in the Word by his Word.

FIRST READING - Ezekiel 2:1-7 (EHV) - 以西结书 2:1-7



THE SACRAMENT 圣餐礼

In this Supper, we celebrate the gift of his redemption, we bear witness to the fellowship we share as confessors of the truth, and we proclaim his death until he returns. Following the teaching of the Bible (1 Corinthians 10:17; 11:27-29; etc.), our church practices "close communion." We ask that only those who are current communicant members of this church or another congregation of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS) partake of the sacrament today. If you are a visitor who is not a member of one of our sister churches, our pastor would be happy to

speak with you about receiving the Lord's Supper with us in the future. Please mention it to him after the service.

C: We lift them up to the Lord.

M: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

C: It is good and right so to do.

M: It is truly good and right that we should at all times and in all places give you thanks, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who promised that wherever two or three come together in his name, there he is with them to shepherd his flock till he comes again in glory. 
WORDS OF INSTITUTION 耶稣设立圣餐的话





RECORDING OF APOLOGETICS & WORLDVIEW CONFERENCE AVAILABLE TO WATCH FREE ONLINE

On June 20, the Center for Apologetics and Worldviews at Bethany Lutheran College (Mankato, MN), held a conference entitled "Defending the Gospel of God: The Apologetics of Jesus, Paul, and the Historical Reliability of the New Testament Records." The presentations were very helpful in addressing some common challenges against the reliability of the Bible, as well as providing ideas for how we can share the gospel with the unbelieving society around us.

WELS PRISON MINISTRY TEST-CORRECTOR VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

WELS Prison Ministry recently began distributing Bible correspondence courses digitally to inmates. The response has been significant, and about 100 additional test correctors are needed to meet the new demand. This ministry can be done at home anywhere in the United States and does not involve any direct mail contact with the inmates. Correctors are asked to review tests in batches of 15 and return them to the Prison Ministry office in a timely fashion. Initially, correctors will receive and return the tests by mail, but the goal is to convert much of the correcting to an online option within the next year. "TRAINING CAMP" WELS YOUTH CAMP – JULY 14-19, INGLESIDE, IL – still room in boys' cabin; girls' cabin full

Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." The purpose of Training Camp is to provide an opportunity for kids to grow in God's Word and enjoy God's creation. Youth entering grades 3 - 9 in the fall are eligible to be campers. Youth entering grades 11 and 12 in the fall are eligible to be junior counselors. Under the guidance of Christian counselors, your child will be involved in daily devotions and Bible studies, arts and crafts, hiking, boating, tower climbing, swimming, singing, and athletics of all types. The total cost per camper is \$500. This includes lodging, meals, camp T-shirt, and all activities. Training Camp is held at YMCA Camp Duncan, in Ingleside, IL.
