PASSION HISTORY READING, PART 4: Luke 23:1-25 (EHV) 耶稣受难的记载,第四部分:路加福音 23:1-25

Jesus' Trial in Pilate's Court

The whole group of them got up and brought him before Pilate. ²They began to accuse him, saying, "We found this fellow misleading our nation, forbidding the payment of taxes to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ, a king."

³Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

"It is as you say," Jesus replied.

⁴Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds, "I find no basis for a charge against this man."

⁵But they kept insisting, "He stirs up the people, teaching all through Judea, beginning from Galilee all the way here."

Pilate Sends Jesus to Herod

⁶When Pilate heard this, he asked if the man was a Galilean. ⁷When he learned that he was under Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, who was also in Jerusalem during those days.

⁸When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad. For a long time, he had wanted to see him, because he had heard many things about him. He hoped to see some miracle performed by him. ⁹He questioned him with many words, but Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰The chief priests and the experts in the law stood there, vehemently accusing him. ¹¹Herod, along with his soldiers, treated him with contempt and ridiculed him. Dressing him in bright clothing, he sent him back to Pilate. ¹²Herod and Pilate became friends with each other on that day. Before this they had been enemies of each other.

¹³Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers, and the people, ¹⁴and said to them, "You brought this man to me as one who is misleading the people. Look, I have examined him in your presence. I have found in this man no basis for the charges you are bringing against him. ¹⁵Herod did not either, for he sent him back to us. ¹ See, he has done nothing worthy of death. ¹⁶So I will have him flogged and release him."

Barabbas or Jesus?

 $^{17}\mbox{Pilate}$ needed to release one prisoner to them at the Festival. 2 $^{18}\mbox{But}$ they all shouted together with one voice: "Take him away! Release Barabbas to us!" $^{19}\mbox{Barabbas}$ had been thrown in prison for a rebellion in the city and for murder.

²⁰Pilate addressed them again, because he wanted to release Jesus. ²¹But they kept shouting, "Crucify! Crucify him!"


²²He said to them the third time, "Why? What evil has he done? I have found no grounds for sentencing him to death. So I will whip him and release him." ²³But they kept pressuring him with loud voices, demanding that he be crucified. And their voices³ were overwhelming. ²⁴So Pilate decided that what they demanded would be done. ²⁵He released the one they had asked for, who had been thrown in prison for rebellion and murder, but he handed Jesus over to their will.

FIRST READING – Judges 10:6-16 (EHV) – 士师记 10:6-16

⁶Once again the people of Israel committed evil in the eyes of the LORD. They served the Baals and the Ashtartes, ^b the gods of Aram, the gods of Sidon, the gods of Moab, the gods of the people of Ammon, and the gods of the Philistines. In this way they forsook the LORD and did not serve him.

⁷So the anger of the LORD burned against Israel, and he sold them into the hand of the Philistines and into the hand of the Ammonites, ⁸who shattered and crushed the people of Israel that year.

For the next eighteen years, the Ammonites oppressed all the people of Israel who were in the territory east of the Jordan, in the land of the Amorites, which is in Gilead. ⁹When the Ammonites also crossed the Jordan to wage war against Judah and Benjamin and against the house of Ephraim, Israel suffered great distress.

¹⁰Finally the people of Israel called out to the LORD, "We have sinned against you, for we have forsaken our God and have served the Baals."

¹¹At this, the LORD said to the people of Israel, "Did I not deliver you from Egypt, from the Amorites, from the Ammonites, and from the Philistines? ¹²When the Sidonians and Amalek and Maon^c oppressed you, and you called out to me, I delivered you from their hands. ¹³It is you who have forsaken me and served other gods. Therefore, I will no longer deliver you. ¹⁴Go and cry out to the gods whom you have chosen! Let them deliver you in the time of your distress!"

¹⁵But the people of Israel said to the LORD, "We have sinned. Do with us whatever seems good in your eyes, but please save us today." ¹⁶When they removed the foreign gods from their midst and served the LORD, he could no longer refrain from relieving^a the misery of Israel.

^b Baal was the most worshipped god and Asherah the most worshipped goddess among the Canaanites. Ashtarte may originally have been a different goddess, but at times she seems interchangeable with Asherah. The forms are plural because Baal and Asherah/Ashtarte had many local forms and local shrines.

GOSPEL - Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32 (EHV) - 路加福音 15:1-3, 11b-32

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming to Jesus to hear him. ²But the Pharisees and the experts in the law were complaining, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

³He told them this parable:

"A certain man had two sons. ¹²The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them. ¹³Not many days later, the younger son gathered together all that he had and traveled to a distant country. There he wasted his wealth with reckless living. ¹⁴After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that country, and he began to be in need. ¹⁵He went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. ¹⁶He would have liked to fill his stomach with the carob pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything.

¹⁷"When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, and I am dying from hunger! ¹⁸I will get up, go to my father, and tell him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight. ¹⁹I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants." '

²⁰"He got up and went to his father. While he was still far away, his father saw him and was filled with compassion. He ran, hugged his son, and kissed him. ²¹The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

²²"But the father said to his servants, 'Quick, bring out the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let us eat and celebrate, ²⁴because this son of mine was dead and is alive again. He was lost and is found.' Then they began to celebrate.

²⁵"His older son was in the field. As he approached the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶He called one of the servants and asked what was going on. ²⁷The servant told him, 'Your brother is here! Your father killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.' ²⁸The older brother was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him.

²⁹"He answered his father, 'Look, these many years I've been serving you, and I never disobeyed your command, but you never gave me even a young goat so that I could celebrate with my friends. ³⁰But

when this son of yours arrived after wasting your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!'



The paraments are purple for the season of Lent. Purple, like black, is a penitential color. Purple dye was also very expensive in the ancient world and was therefore worn mostly by royalty; the Bible records that, as the Roman soldiers mocked and tortured Jesus on Good Friday, they put a purple robe on him to ridicule him and belittle the claim that he was a king. Therefore, purple is used during this penitential season of Lent as a vivid reminder of the contempt and scorn Jesus endured, and the sacrifice he made for our eternal salvation.

"TRAINING CAMP" WELS YOUTH CAMP - JULY 13-18, INGLESIDE, IL

Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." The purpose of Training Camp is to provide an opportunity for kids to grow in God's Word and enjoy God's creation. Youth entering grades 3 - 9 in the fall are eligible to be campers. Youth entering grades 11 and 12 in the fall are eligible to be junior counselors. Under the guidance of Christian counselors, campers will be involved in daily devotions and Bible studies, arts and crafts, hiking, boating, tower climbing, swimming, singing, and athletics of all types.
