**PASSION HISTORY READING, PART 1: Luke 22:1-38 (EHV)** 耶稣受难的记载,第一部分:路加福音22:1-28

#### The Plot to Kill Jesus

The Festival of Unleavened Bread, which is called the Passover, was approaching. <sup>2</sup>The chief priests and the experts in the law were trying to find some way to put Jesus to death, because they were afraid of the people. <sup>3</sup>Then Satan entered Judas, called Iscariot, who was one of the Twelve. <sup>4</sup>He went away and spoke with the chief priests and officers of

the temple guard about how he could betray Jesus to them. <sup>5</sup>They were glad and agreed to give him money. <sup>6</sup>He promised to do it and was looking for an opportunity to betray Jesus to them away from the crowd.

#### Jesus Celebrates the Passover

<sup>7</sup>The day of Unleavened Bread arrived, when it was necessary to sacrifice the Passover lamb. <sup>8</sup>Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go prepare the Passover for us, so that we may eat it."

<sup>9</sup>They said to him, "Where do you want us to prepare it?"

<sup>10</sup>He told them, "Just as you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters. <sup>11</sup>Tell the owner of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" <sup>12</sup>He will show you a large, furnished upper room. Make preparations there." <sup>13</sup>They went and found things just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

<sup>14</sup>When the hour had come, Jesus reclined at the table with the twelve apostles. <sup>15</sup>He said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer, <sup>16</sup>for I tell you, I will not eat it again until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

<sup>17</sup>He took a cup, gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves, <sup>18</sup>for I tell you, from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

#### The Lord's Supper

<sup>19</sup>He took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." <sup>20</sup>In the same way, he took the cup after the supper, saying, "This cup is the new testament<sup>1</sup> in my blood, which is being poured out for you.

#### One Will Betray Jesus

<sup>21</sup>"But look, the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. <sup>22</sup>The Son of Man is going to go as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom he is betrayed!"

<sup>23</sup>They began to discuss with one another which of them it was who was going to do this.

#### Who Is Greatest?

<sup>24</sup>A dispute arose among the disciples about which of them was considered to be greatest. <sup>25</sup>But he told them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them, and those who have authority over them are called Benefactors. <sup>26</sup>But it is not to be that way with you. Instead, let the greatest among you become like the youngest, and the one who leads like the one who serves. <sup>27</sup>For who is greater, one who reclines at the table or one who serves? Isn't it the one who reclines at the table? But I am among you as one who serves. <sup>28</sup>You are those who have remained with me in my trials. <sup>29</sup>I am going to grant a kingdom to you, just as my Father granted to me, <sup>30</sup>so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom. And you will sit on thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel."

#### Jesus Predicts Peter's Denial

<sup>31</sup>The Lord said, "Simon, Simon, pay attention: Satan has asked to have you all, so that he may sift you as wheat. <sup>32</sup>But I prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have returned to me, strengthen your brothers."

<sup>33</sup>He said to him, "Lord, I am ready to go with you both to prison and to death!"

<sup>34</sup>But Jesus replied, "I tell you, Peter, the rooster will not crow today until you deny three times that you know me."

<sup>35</sup>He said to them, "When I sent you out without money bag, traveler's bag, and sandals, did you lack anything?"

"Nothing," they said.

<sup>36</sup>Then he told them, "But now, let the one who has a money bag take it, and likewise a traveler's bag. And let the one who has no sword sell his cloak and buy one. <sup>37</sup>For I tell you that this Scripture must be fulfilled in me: 'He was counted with transgressors.'<sup>2</sup> Indeed, what is written about me is going to have its fulfillment."

<sup>38</sup>They said, "Lord, look, here are two swords."

He said to them, "That is enough."

#### FIRST READING – 1 Samuel 17:4-11, 32-40, 45-49 (EHV) – 撒母耳记上 17:4-11, 32-40, 45-49

<sup>4</sup>A challenger who represented the Philistines came out from the camp of the Philistines. He was named Goliath of Gath. He was nine feet, six inches tall.<sup>a 5</sup>He had a bronze helmet on his head, and he wore scaled body armor, which was made of more than one hundred pounds<sup>b</sup> of bronze. <sup>6</sup>He had bronze greaves on his shins and a bronze spear slung between his shoulders. <sup>7</sup>The shaft<sup>c</sup> of his spear was like a weaver's beam, and his spearhead was made of fifteen pounds<sup>d</sup> of iron. His shield bearer went out ahead of him.

<sup>8</sup>He would stand up and shout to the armies of Israel, "Why have you come out to line up in battle formation? I am a Philistine, and you are servants of Saul, aren't you? Choose a man to represent you, and let him come down to me. <sup>9</sup>If he is able to fight with me and kill me, we will be your servants. But if I overcome him and kill him, you will become our servants, and you will serve us." <sup>10</sup>The Philistine would say, "I defy the ranks of Israel today! Give me a man, and we will fight each other!" <sup>11</sup>When Saul and all Israel heard those words of the Philistine, they lost their courage and were terrified.

<sup>32</sup>David said to Saul, "Do not let anyone lose heart because of this Philistine! Your servant will go and fight him."

<sup>33</sup>But Saul said to David, "You cannot go against this Philistine to fight with him, because you are just a boy, and he has been a warrior since he was a youth."

<sup>34</sup>David said to Saul, "Your servant has been taking care of his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and took a lamb from the flock, <sup>35</sup>I went after it and struck it and rescued the lamb out of its mouth. When the lion reared up against me, I grabbed it by its mane,

struck it, and killed it. <sup>36</sup>Your servant struck both the lion and the bear. This uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, since he has defied the ranks of the living God." <sup>37</sup>David added, "The LORD, who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine."

Saul said to David, "Go then! May the LORD be with you." <sup>38</sup>So Saul dressed David in his own gear.<sup>b</sup> He placed a bronze helmet on his head and dressed him in scaled body armor. <sup>39</sup>David strapped his sword over his gear. David tried to walk around in them, since he had never trained with this kind of equipment before.

David said to Saul, "I cannot go in these, because I have never trained with them." So David took them off.

<sup>40</sup>Then David took his staff in his hand and picked five smooth stones out of the stream bed and put them into the pouch of his shepherd's bag. He took his sling in his hand and approached the Philistine.

<sup>45</sup>Then David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD of Armies, the God of the ranks of Israel, whom you have defied. <sup>46</sup>Today the LORD will hand you over to me. I will strike you down and cut off your head. Today I will give the dead bodies of the army of the Philistines to the birds of the air and to the wild animals of the earth. Then all the earth will know that there is a God in Israel, <sup>47</sup>and all those gathered here will know that the LORD does not save with sword and spear, for the battle belongs to the LORD, and he will deliver you into our hand."

<sup>48</sup>Then, when the Philistine started advancing to attack David, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet the Philistine. <sup>49</sup>David put his hand into his bag, took a stone from it, shot it from his sling, and struck the Philistine on the forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell facedown to the ground.

#### SECOND READING - Hebrews 4:14-16 (EHV) - 希伯来书 4:14-16

<sup>14</sup>Therefore, since we have a great high priest, who has gone through the heavens, namely, Jesus the Son of God, let us continue to hold on to our confession. <sup>15</sup>For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has been tempted in

every way, just as we are, yet was without sin. <sup>16</sup>So let us approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

#### GOSPEL – Luke 4:1-13 (EHV) – 路加福音 4:1-13

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, <sup>2</sup>where he was tempted by the Devil for forty days. He did not eat anything during those days. When they came to an end, he was hungry. <sup>3</sup>The Devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread."

<sup>4</sup>Jesus answered him, "It is written: 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.' "<sup>a</sup>

<sup>5</sup>The Devil led him up to a high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. <sup>6</sup>The Devil told him, "I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, because it has been entrusted to me, and I can give it to anyone I want. <sup>7</sup>So, if you worship me, it will all be yours."

<sup>9</sup>The Devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the pinnacle of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from here, <sup>10</sup>because it is written:

He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you. <sup>11</sup>And,

they will lift you up with their hands,

so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."<sup>c</sup>

<sup>13</sup>When the Devil had finished every temptation, he left him until an opportune time.





The paraments are purple for the season of Lent. Purple, like black, is a penitential color. Purple dye was also very expensive in the ancient world and was therefore worn mostly by royalty; the Bible records that, as the Roman soldiers mocked and tortured Jesus on Good Friday, they put a purple robe on him to ridicule him and belittle the claim that he was a king. Therefore, purple is used during this penitential season of Lent as a vivid reminder of the contempt and scorn Jesus endured, and the sacrifice he made for our eternal salvation.
