#### INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP SERVICE

Jesus shows us the full extent of God's love for us. The Church calls this day "Maundy" because of Jesus' "new command" (in Latin: "novum mandatum") in John 13:34-35, that his followers ought to "love one another" as he has loved us. The Gospel readings for this day in two years of the three-year lectionary cycle focus on Jesus' institution of the Lord's Supper, while in the third lectionary-year focusing on Jesus' command for humility and love. Jesus shows the full extent of his love in both service and sacrifice. He loves us more than life itself, and feeds us his flesh and blood in the Lord's Supper to prove it. Having been

reconciled to God through the flesh and blood of Christ, we now follow his command to love each other as he has loved us – with selfless, self-sacrificing love.

The action of ceremonially stripping the altar at the end of the service prepares the chancel and the congregation for the solemn worship of Good Friday. The service concludes today without a blessing, since conceptually this service continues through the Good Friday service tomorrow and to its conclusion in the service on Easter Sunday.

#### Regarding the Lord's Supper and "Closed Communion"

Our Lord Jesus has given us a holy Supper in which we receive his true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. In this Supper, we celebrate the gift of his redemption, we bear witness to the fellowship we share as confessors of the truth, and we proclaim his death until he returns.

Following the teaching of the Bible (1 Corinthians 10:17; 11:27-29; etc.), our church practices closed communion. We ask that only those who are current communicant members of this church or another congregation of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS) partake of the sacrament today. If you are not a current member of this church or one of our sister churches, our pastor would be happy to speak with you about receiving the Lord's Supper with us in the future. Please mention it to him after the service.

**Communicant members** are encouraged to prepare for the Lord's Supper using the "Personal Preparation for Holy Communion" on p. 156 in the front part of the hymnal (the red book in the pew rack).



<sup>15</sup>The Holy Spirit also testifies in Scripture<sup>d</sup> to us, for first he said:

after those days, says the Lord.

I will put my laws on their hearts and I will write them on their mind.<sup>e</sup>





#### INSTRUCTION FOR THE END OF LENT 预苦期末教导

M: In this Lenten season we have heard again how our Lord walked the path of suffering which led him to the cross for our salvation. We have also heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and one another. This is the struggle to which we were committed at Baptism. God's forgiveness and the power of his Spirit to amend our lives continue with us because of his love for us in Jesus our Savior.

Within the family of the Church, God never wearies of giving peace and new life. In the absolution, we receive forgiveness as from God himself. This absolution we should not doubt, but firmly believe that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven, for it comes to us in the name and by the command of our Lord.

We who receive God's love in Jesus Christ are called to love one another, to be servants to each other, as Jesus became our servant.

In Holy Communion, the members of Christ's body participate most intimately in his love. Remembering our Lord's Last Supper with his disciples, we eat the bread and drink the cup of this meal. Together we receive the Lord's gift of his body and blood for

forgiveness and participate in that new covenant that makes us one with him and one another. The Lord's Supper is the promise of the great banquet we will share with all the faithful when our Lord returns, the joyous culmination of our reconciliation with God and each other.

#### CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION 认罪及赦罪

M: Let us confess our sins to God and ask for his forgiveness.

KNEEL OR STAND

C: Almighty God, merciful Father,
I confess to you that I have not loved you with all my heart.
In what I have done and left undone,
I have pursued my ways instead of your ways.
I have not loved my brothers and sisters as myself.
For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

I am truly sorry for my sins.
I repent of them.
I beg for your mercy, O Lord.

Silence for meditation

**M:** Forgive us for the sake of Jesus Christ who suffered and died for us.

C: Cleanse me from my sins.
Release me from my guilt.
Grant me your Holy Spirit to amend my sinful life.

The minister pronounces a corporate absolution with these words:

**M:** The almighty God has been merciful to us and has sent his Son to die for all. For his sake, God forgives our sins and calls us from darkness to his marvelous light.

Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

- M: O Holy Spirit, dwell within us as we remember our Lord's death in this sacrament. Enter our hearts to strengthen our faith and fill us with gratitude for your great mercy.
- C: Move us to encourage one another to love and to do good works.
- M: Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions.

#### Silent prayer.

- M: As our Lord served his disciples by washing their feet, so may we also humbly serve one another.
- C: Help us live our lives as sacrifices of thanksgiving to him who first loved us. Amen.


**M:** Lift up your hearts.


#### WORDS OF INSTITUTION 耶稣设立圣餐的话

DISTRIBUTION 分发圣餐 – 只邀请已经受坚信礼的本会成员来领受 At the direction of the usher, current communicant members of St. Andrew and our sister churches in the WELS and ELS may come forward down the center aisle, then wait until directed by an usher to go to the communion rail. Communicants may kneel or stay standing. Please hold out your hand to receive the bread. If you'd like to partake of the

common cup, do not take an individual cup when the assistant comes by with the tray. Those who need to receive grape juice instead of wine may take the purple individual cups in the center of the tray. The minister and assistant will use hand sanitizer before and/or wear sterile gloves during communion setup and distribution. Gluten-free wafers are available; please speak with the pastor or an usher to receive one.

### STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR 移走祭坛的装饰

Psalm 88 is read by a lector. During the reading of the psalm, the altar is solemnly stripped, in token of Jesus' abandonment by his disciples and in

preparation for the Good Friday worship service.

The paraments are purple for the season of Lent. Purple, like black, is a penitential color. Purple dye was also very expensive in the ancient world and was therefore worn mostly by royalty; the Bible records that, as the Roman soldiers mocked and tortured Jesus on Good Friday, they put a purple robe on him to ridicule him and belittle the claim that he was a king. Therefore, purple is used during this penitential season of Lent as a vivid reminder of the contempt and scorn Jesus endured, and the sacrifice he made for our eternal salvation.

#### HOLY WEEK AND EASTER WORSHIP SERVICES

Our Holy Week worship continues tomorrow with our **Good Friday** worship, April 18 at 7:00pm, commemorating the death of Jesus on the cross, by which he broke the devil's power over us by paying for the sins of the whole world.
