**M:** We have come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve him as his dear children. But we have disobeyed him


and deserve only his wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to him and plead for his mercy.

### FIRST READING - Acts 5:12, 17-32 (EHV) - 使徒行传 5:12, 17-32

<sup>12</sup>Many signs and wonders were done among the people through the hands of the apostles. With one mind, they all continued meeting in Solomon's Colonnade.

<sup>17</sup>The high priest rose up, along with his associates (that is, the party of the Sadducees), because they were filled with envy. <sup>18</sup>They arrested the apostles and put them in the public prison. <sup>19</sup>But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the doors of the prison, brought them out, and said, <sup>20</sup>"Go, stand in the temple and keep on telling the people the whole message about this life." <sup>21</sup>After they heard this, they entered the temple courts at daybreak and began to teach.

When the high priest and his associates arrived, they called together the Sanhedrin (that is, the whole council of elders of the people of Israel). Then they sent orders to the jail to have the apostles brought in. <sup>22</sup>But when the officers arrived, they did not find them in the prison. They returned and reported, <sup>23</sup>"We found the prison securely locked and the guards standing at the doors, but when we opened them, we found no one inside!" <sup>24</sup>When the captain of the temple guard and the chief priests heard these words, they were puzzled about them, wondering what could have happened.

<sup>25</sup>Then someone came and reported to them, "Look! The men you put in prison are standing in the temple courts and teaching the people."


<sup>26</sup>Then the captain went with the officers and brought the apostles in without force, because they were afraid that the people might stone them. <sup>27</sup>After they brought them in, they had them stand before the Sanhedrin. The high priest asked them, <sup>28</sup>"Did we not give you strict orders not to teach in this name? <sup>a</sup> Look, you have filled Jerusalem with

your teaching, and you are determined to bring this man's blood down on us!"

<sup>29</sup>But Peter and the apostles replied, "We must obey God rather than men. <sup>30</sup>The God of our fathers raised Jesus, whom you arrested and killed by hanging him on a cross. <sup>31</sup>God exalted him to his right hand as Prince and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and the forgiveness of sins. <sup>32</sup>We are witnesses<sup>b</sup> of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

ADULT BIBLE STUDY: "Helping the Hurting with Hope" – Sundays 11:00 This Bible study series seeks to help participants appreciate the role of compassion in a Christian's personal and congregational life. It provides gospel motivation for participants to go beyond their comfort zones and act in compassionate ways through the Spirit's power. By cultivating compassion, congregations will be better spiritual refuges for people with broken lives, and welcome people looking for a church family where they can walk a new path after release from prison, or in recovery from addiction, or starting a new life after a public fall into sin.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL – 11:00 / after worship

Sunday school is held after the worship service, either in the church basement or in the ministry center (next-door to church). Sunday school is open to children from age 3 through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. (High-schoolers are welcome to join adult Bible study in church during the same time.) All are welcome!

YOUTH CONFIRMATION CLASS – Thursdays 6:30pm; alt. time possible Youth confirmation class is open to youth in grades 5 through 8, and to high-schoolers who have not yet been confirmed. The class is currently held on Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:00, but we could adjust the class day or time if needed, to accommodate the schedules of everyone who is interested.

#### NOTE ABOUT FOOD AND DRINK IN CHURCH

We're so glad to be able to use the area in the back of our worship space for fellowship and meals! "TRAINING CAMP" WELS YOUTH CAMP - JULY 13-18, INGLESIDE, IL

Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." The purpose of Training Camp is to provide an opportunity for kids to grow in God's Word and enjoy God's creation. Youth entering grades 3 - 9 in the fall are eligible to be campers.
