

“THE SHROUD OF JESUS? ITS ARCHEOLOGICAL AND APOLOGETIC VALUE” – live-stream recording available

“Shroud of Turin” is likely the most studied religious artifact. Scientists in 1978 and 1988 concluded that the Shroud was a medieval fake.

However, their results were contested due to unscientific procedures, invalid results, and disqualifying inconsistencies. The 2020s brought fresh and exacting analysis, exploding the methodology and results of the 70s and 80s. So much so, that a consensus has formed: The Shroud belongs to first century Jerusalem. Circumstantially, the Shroud bears all the marks of being the very burial cloth that enshrouded the crucified and resurrected body of Christ Jesus.
