INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP SERVICE

The intimate connection to our risen Lord wrought by the gospel has rich consequences for our life with him even now.

About the paschal candle – The flame of the paschal candle symbolizes the presence of the resurrected Christ, the light of the world. The word "paschal" comes from the Hebrew word for Passover ("Pesach"). The Apostle Paul identifies Good Friday and Easter as the fulfillment of the Passover: "Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed" (1 Corinthians 5:7). In many languages, "Passover" is the word used to refer to Easter.





FIRST READING - Acts 8:26-40 (EHV)

²⁶Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is an isolated area.) ²⁷So he got up and went. And there was a man, an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of Candace, Queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship. ²⁸He was on his way home, sitting in his chariot and reading the prophet Isaiah.

²⁹The Spirit told Philip, "Go over there and stay close to that chariot." ³⁰Philip ran up to it and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet. Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"

³¹The man replied, "How can I unless someone explains it to me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.





PASTOR GAWEL'S CALL DELIBERATIONS; VOTERS' MEETING TODAY (4/28) From Pastor Gawel:

On April 7, I received a call to serve as pastor of Apostles Lutheran Church in San Jose, California. As you may know, this does not mean that I have to accept the call and go there, but that I now get to spend some time in prayer and deliberation between these two calls from God -- the one to serve with you here at St. Andrew, the other to go and serve with our brothers and sisters in Christ at Apostles in San Jose. Please pray for God's blessing of wisdom and guidance for me as I deliberate, and for his blessing on Sherry and our kids, and on all of the members of St. Andrew and all the members of Apostles during this time. I would be happy to talk with you to hear your thoughts as I deliberate. Feel free to arrange a time to get together to talk, or give me a call.

Also, we will have a voters' meeting today (April 28) after the worship service to discuss making a contingent request for a graduate from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary to be assigned as pastor in the event that I would accept the call to San Jose. The reason for this is that the deadline for making a request for a graduate is April 30, but I will likely still be deliberating on the call at that point, and so the Assignment Committee allows contingent requests to for a graduate to be made, which can then be cancelled before Assignment Day (May 23) if it turns out that a graduate will not be needed (ie, if I decline the call to San Jose). Note that in keeping with God's instruction to us in his Word regarding the roles of men and women in the church (cf., 1 Timothy 2:12; 1 Corinthians 14:33-35), St. Andrew's constitution and by-laws authorizes male communicant members of this congregation over the age of 18 as voters. Any non-voting member (or nonmember) may speak with a voting member or the pastor in advance of the meeting with any suggestions or concerns. ... Please pray for God's blessing on this meeting and on the gospel ministry of St. Andrew Lutheran Church!

ASCENSION OBSERVED ON SUNDAY MAY 12

This year we will again observe the Ascension of Our Lord during our regular worship service (9:30am) on the Sunday (May 12) following the Thursday that is officially Ascension Day. Acts 1:3 tells us that Jesus appeared to his disciples "over a period of forty days" after his resurrection; thus, the Christian Church commemorates the Festival of the Ascension of Our Lord on the sixth Thursday after Easter (the 40th day after Easter). The truth of Jesus' ascension is a great comfort for us, because it assures us that Jesus' work of saving us is complete and has been accepted by God the Father, and that Jesus is now reigning over all things for our eternal good, and is at the right hand of the Father interceding for us. In order to enable more of our members to hear and celebrate these comforting truths, we will observe the Ascension of Our Lord this year in our worship service on the following Sunday (5/12) rather than on Thursday. Please join us on Sunday May 12 to celebrate all that Jesus' ascension means for us!
