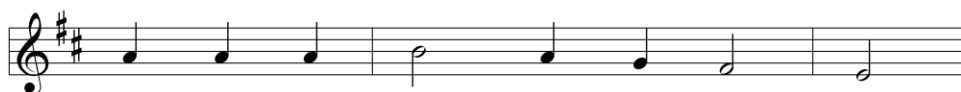

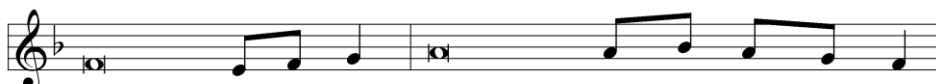

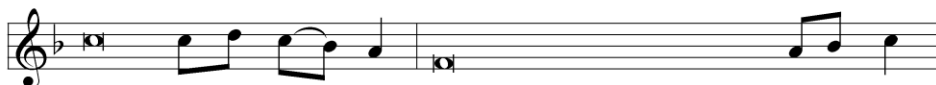

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Women's Bible Study will start up again on Wednesday, September 16, at 12:30pm, in person or via Zoom. This year, we will be studying Deb Burma's book entitled "Be Still & Know", a Bible study anchored in Psalm 46 that guides women through life's storms, with Scripture, reflective journaling, and stories of real women finding Christ's refuge amid sickness, anxiety, shame, and sorrow.

As Deb Burma states: "We will unpack the promises found in Psalm 46 and fulfilled in Christ. In these eight chapters, you will study the psalm in detail, examine stormy situations, and review narratives from the Gospels, where Jesus meets various women in the midst of their turmoil. Each chapter is divided into five sections, forty sections total. And each chapter is supported by discussion questions and an optional video segment to help you further unpack Scripture and apply it to your life. This flexible format will encourage daily study and devotion time for personal or group study.

God's Word promises that in whatever kind of storm you find yourself, Jesus always comes to you. May your study of Psalm 46 assure you of His refuge, strength, help, and hope."
